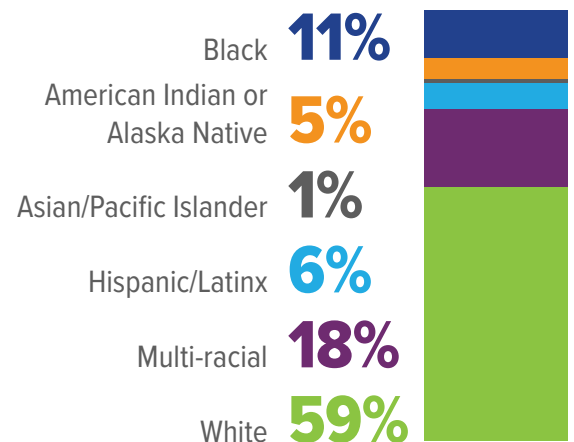
HANDS-ON LEARNING

The Council Oak Elementary teaching philosophy places significant value on partnering with students as active participants in their learning. We provide children with collaborative workspaces, materials for constructivist thinking and hands-on exploration to increase their engagement with the curriculum. Illustrating the children's educational process and growth, the walls of our classrooms are lined with student work to highlight their thinking.

In addition, our teachers offer flexible seating, so students can utilize a variety of workspaces for group projects. Students are provided choices in their learning so they can take ownership of their schoolwork and demonstrate an ability to solve problems for themselves in the future.

FOCUS ON THE WHOLE CHILD

Council Oak Elementary School is one of five recipients of the Wallace Foundation's Social/Emotional Learning Grant, aimed at supporting the development of children's cognitive, interpersonal and character-building skills through an improved curriculum. We focus on restorative practices rather than punitive, so we can educate the whole child by meeting his or her social, emotional and academic needs. Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions.

With strong social and emotional skills, our students will be able to set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships and make responsible decisions.

A THRIVING COMMUNITY AND LEGACY

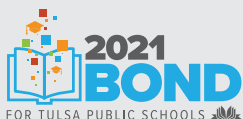
